First, I would like to start with a huge thank you for such a warm welcome as I take on the position of Curator at the historical society. Your encouraging words and support are very much appreciated. I greatly look forward to being a part of such a wonderful institution and am excited to inform you all what I have been working on.

I am very happy to announce that big things are happening over at the Caleb Smith House. We have launched a complete re-haul of all the collection storage spaces. Each room will be reconfigured and or-

ganized with best museum practices to optimize space and protect the health of our collection. As we rehouse each object, we will make sure they are tagged and properly inventoried; eventually, all archival materials will be refreshed. While this is happening, object data will also be uploaded to our digital database, making the collection available for browsing online with the aim to reach a broader audience through more accessibility. Making the collection more accessible will create a greater interest in the historical society and its holdings.

During this transition period, our current exhibition *Woven Wonders: Highlights* from the Textile Collection will be on view for another year. But, you can look forward to a new exhibition opening in 2020!

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED



The Smithtown Historical Society is proud to once again offer junior year students in the Township of Smithtown an opportunity to win a \$1,000.00 scholarship. The Mildred Smith Historical Essay Scholarship Contest is open to all 11th graders in attendance at Commack, Hauppauge, Kings Park, Smithtown East & West High Schools, as well as at The Knox School and Smithtown Christian School.

This year's winner Bridget Flynn is a senior at Commack High School. She is the captain of her alter serving team at St. Anthony of Padua. She has been a member of the Girls Spring Track team since her freshman year and Cross Coun-

try and Winter track teams since her sophomore year. She is the Vice President of the Interact club, the junior version of Rotary, and is a member of the National Honor Society and the Science Honor Society.

Bridget recently joined the Commack Volunteer Ambulance Corps. She also volunteers yearly at the Maria Z Hope Foundation fundraiser, Relay for Life and at Bob Sweeney's Camp Hope for grieving children. She participated in Built by Girls, a program to encourage girls to pursue computer science. Bridget is interested in the field of STEM and is considering a Math major when she heads to college next year. She hopes to attend Binghamton in upstate New York.

The Annual Mildred Smith Historical Essay Scholarship Contest is now in its twelfth year. 2018's question was: How do you plan to become a hero for the Smithtown Community? Bridget wrote an intense essay. The essay was reviewed by a panel of Judges. On Thursday, October 18th, at the Smithtown Historical Society's 2018 Heritage Ball, Bridget was awarded the \$1,000 Scholarship, which she will be using for her college education.

Every year, the Smithtown Historical Society offers junior year students in the Township of Smithtown an opportunity to win a \$1,000 scholarship. The Mildred Smith Historical Essay Contest, a scholarship award, is open to all 11th graders in attendance at Commack, Hauppauge, Kings Park, Smithtown East & West High Schools, as well as at The Knox School and Smithtown Christian School.

Mildred Smith was an original founder of the Smithtown Historical Society and its first President. She possessed an intense passion for the history of Smithtown and was a great friend and supporter of the Society. The Smithtown Historical Society is proud to honor her through this annual essay contest and hopes that the spirit of Ms. Smith will live on in the devotion and hard work of students submitting essays for consideration.

The Annual Mildred Smith Historical Essay Scholarship Contest is in its twelfth year. This year we ask the contestants to interview someone who has lived in the area for at least 50 years. (4-6 pages.) Submissions for the contest will be accepted from now until April 29th, 2019 up until 5 pm in the Smithtown Historical Society's headquarters at the Roseneath Cottage, 239 Middle Country Road, Smithtown, New York 11787.

Marie Curie, born in November 1867, was a Polish and naturalized-French physicist and chemist, plus a wife, mother, and an extraordinary scientist. She was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize, the first person to win it twice, and still the **only** person to win it in two different sciences!

Our presenter this evening will be Edward A. Sierra. Edward is a former Nuclear Reactor Operator, President Elect of the Long Island section of the American Nuclear Society, an Adjunct Instructor at Suffolk County Community College, and a proud US Navy submarine service veteran.
